## April 18, 2022

The Kingsley City Council met in regular session on April 18, 2022. Those present were Mayor Bohle, Councilmen Rolling, Beelner, Kremer, Jasperson and Bohle.

The agenda was approved on motion by Bohle, seconded by Beelner, all voted aye, motion carried.

Public Forum: Ken Carlson introduced himself to the Council. He is from Whiting and is running for the Iowa House in District 13.

Dennis Beelner and Dave Krieg talked with the Council regarding the sidewalk north of the BCK additions. They would like to see the City take this over. Sidewalk (trail) is nine hundred (900) feet long and eight (8) feet wide. Motion by Rolling to take over the sidewalk from Karl Koelling's residence to Quest Ave. (excluding the section on N Pt Lot 1, Blk 2, Hillview Estates). There will have to be a survey done of the sidewalk area. Motion seconded by Jasperson, all voted aye, motion carried.

Motion by Beelner, seconded by Kremer to approve paying the \$233.00 (annually) Plan G deductible for Steve Jantz, all voted aye, motion carried.

Representatives of the Brookside Golf Club talked with the Council concerning the three bridges at the golf course. Bohle will call the Plymouth County Engineer and Attorney Thompson will call Beck Engineering for opinions on what can be done to the existing bridges or replacement options. Motion by Rolling, seconded by Bohle to hire an engineer to do the preliminary evaluation. City will pay the initial engineering bills. All voted aye, motion carried.

United Healthcare insurance will be renewed for the next year with a seven (7) percent increase in premiums, coverage will remain the same. Bids were sought from local agents with no replies. Motion by Beelner, seconded by Kremer to accept the proposal from United Healthcare. Rolling, aye; Beelner, aye; Kremer, aye; Jasperson, aye; Bohle, abstain. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn by Jasperson, seconded by Beelner, all voted aye, motion carried.
